





- 1- Think of a story/idea you want to show!
- 2- Break your story down into a couple of moments each moment will have its own panel (box). Draw those boxes.
- 3- In pencil, sketch the picture. Leave room for your words/speech bubbles!
- 4- In pencil, write your words/speech!
- 5- Once you're happy with how it looks, **trace over all of it in pen!**
- 6- PRO TIP: Make a copy/scan of your black and white version so you can try different color schemes!
- 7- If you want, add color!
- 8- Publish or display your work!
